## POP PROOFS: Justice love and truth

## JUSTICE:

It is unjust to condemn someone for a crime they had no choice in committing.

No trespassing signs must be posted where they can be seen. If the only water in 100 miles is within that zone, is justice served by prosecuting the offense if the signs are not properly posted or the population is illiterate?

And if a way across the no-trespass zone is granted 10 years after the condemned person dies, was the same justice served to them?

And if that person could not read signs or if someone told them it said 'come this way' are they still worthy of condemnation?

Is God still just if He claims to have offered salvation through Jesus but some never heard, some never saw the signs, some died before God fulfilled the offer, some were lied to about what that offer was. God is only just if everyone can benefit by the salvation He offers in Jesus Christ. Time, lies ignorance, or necessity cannot be mitigating factors to God's offer. If God is omnipotent, omniscient and omnipresent He must be able to account for those factors in any offer He makes. Anything less would make Him just a god and not the Creator God.

He did! God is just. Salvation in Hell is the revelation of how God has prepared for these contingencies. This proves that Jesus can be the saviour of everyone. Including those who died in ignorance of Him and His offer, those who were lied to and those who seemed to have no choice but to reject Him.

## TRUTH:
